

Measuring Academic Success:

- Charter board membership can get complicated. To help navigate through it, make sure board operations stay in service of your board's mission specific goals.
- Most charter schools have a specific academic focus. Make sure your school's academic results are excellent, especially in your area of specialization.
- Test results and GPAs are important indicators of success, but they're not the only ones. Other factors, like student happiness and parental satisfaction, are equally important.
- Start by forming an 'Academic Excellence Committee' a special team of board members that is dedicated to tracking academic results. Once established, they can decide what indicators to track, and how often to track them.

Staying Compliant:


- A charter school's autonomy is one of it's most attractive features. However, the basic essentials of the curriculum can't be forgotten. If they are, your charter can and will be revoked.
- A unique approach is key but effective student learning is the most important duty of any school.
- Once you've established your charter, you need to set up a comprehensive performance framework in order to keep it.

Challenges:

- A positive relationship with the local community is a necessity for any charter school, especially since funding is typically much lower than that of district schools.
- Be open to finding creative solutions: pool resources where you can, and accept help in the form of donations and time from local organizations.

Hiring:

- While you aren't in control of specific hiring decisions, you can help the school leadership form a well-rounded idea of what kind of teachers they should be looking to hire.
- The school leader is the one responsible for most day-to-day operations of the school. Because of this, they will be the most important hire you make. Choose wisely, and build a good working relationship.
